The Discipline of Government and International Relations in the Faculty of Economics and Business seeks to appoint a Senior Lecturer (Level C) or Lecturer (Level B) in International Relations. The appointment will be commensurate with the applicant's qualifications and experience. The successful applicant will be located within the Discipline of Government and International Relations but will work closely with others in the University. Government and International Relations teaches a wide variety of units of study in political science, public policy, Australian government, electoral studies, democratic theory and practice, and international relations, and has a very active research program with considerable success in attracting research funding.

The successful applicant will be expected to contribute to the undergraduate and postgraduate teaching programs in international relations, to supervise postgraduate research students doing PhDs, and pursue a research program that receives international recognition. Undergraduate and post graduate coursework students come from a variety of degrees including International Studies, Public Policy, Arts, Commerce, Economics, International Business, and Social Science. Members of the Discipline conduct internationally renowned research in all areas of public policy and international relations

Applicants must have a PhD in political science, international relations, or a cognate discipline and an established track record of high quality international research publications, teaching and lecturing ability, and the potential to contribute to advanced level programs.

Applicants with specialisation in any area of international relations are welcome, particularly including international risk analysis, international security and international organisations, international relations theory, Australian foreign and defence policy, and the like.

Administrative skills are highly desirable.
